

a word from our executive director


Dear Genesee Valley family,



what we do

Genesee Valley Outdoor Learning Center, a 501(c)(3) private non profit has been providing outdoor experiential learning opportunities for student, sports teams, scouts, adults, corporate and non profit organizations through nature, ropes courses, group initiatives and overnight camping experiences. GVOLC is based on 140 acres of farmland, woodland, lakes and open fields in Northern Baltimore County, MD.

"Our mission is to provide quality learning experiences that promote growth and nourish the development of individuals of all ages and backgrounds"

<u>Spring, Summer, Fall Programming</u> - experiential learning by doing! We develop a unique program based on the goals and needs of the group! Group initiatives, low ropes, high ropes course and debrief processing!

<u>Summer Camp</u> - 5 days of summer day camp fun for ages 4-15! Exploring in the woods, swimming, high ropes courses, boating, arts&crafts, lasting friendships and more!

<u>Seedling Early Childhood Program</u> - 3-5 year old expanding their knowledge through nature exploration and outdoor curiosity. Kids get to be kids here: learning to care for each other, lessons on trial and error and building life long relationship with nature and self.

<u>Adventure Therapy</u> - this approach ditches the 4 walled office allows licensed therapist to utilize outdoors to be present, process, and build skills for success. Individual, group, and family sessions.

<u>Athletic Events</u> - 7 regulation sports field for soccer and lacrosse. Host site for Hereford Rec and Club teams and girls lacrosse showcase tournaments. Archery Facility and Trail Running venue.





Experiential Learning – team building, leadership & community



GVOLC's Experiential Education Program is the heart of all we do to help individuals and groups find their inner grit and grace to meet new challenges. The program utilizes our challenge course, one of the most extensive courses on the east coast, to actively focus on developing communication, cooperation, healthy risk-taking, leadership, trust, persistence and creative problem-solving skills.

Individuals of all ages come to our outdoor learning center to engage in team-building and problem solving activities that utilize our low and high ropes course elements. Although fun is high on our priority list, there is more to it than that; our facilitators debrief' participants after activities and use the course to discuss ways to meet everyday life head on. Participants grow through both verbal discussions and physical challenges that encourage them to step outside their comfort zone.

Based on the goals of each group, GVOLC facilitators customize programs to meet their needs over half-day, full-day or week-long overnight experiences. GVOLC also offers off-site team building programs year-round. GVOLC is an institutional member of The Association of Challenge CourseTechnology and is a member of Association for Experiential Education.

summer camp

Our summer day camp offers campers ages 4 – 16 the opportunity to explore the outdoors, step out of their comfort zone, and build relationships with others. Our highly trained counselors work hard to foster a nurturing and safe environment for each camper. Activities range from archery, fishing, boating, nature crafts to zipping and dipping into one of our lakes.

Summer Camp runs for 10 weeks from 9:00-4:00. Summer 2023 was one of our largest summer programs serving approximately 150 campers each week.



Genesee Valley has been accredited by The American Camp Association for the past 10 years.










Summer Camp Growth





Athletic Facilities

Sports fields: 7 regulation and 2 youth sports fields (lacrosse, soccer). We are the home fields for our 500 youth players that are part of the local recreation and club programs. The fields are also a location for tournaments that showcase future collegiate athletes. Over the course of these tournaments there are approximately 16,000 athletes utilizing the fields.

Archery: Home site for Oriole Archers of Baltimore. This includes the site for the Senior Arching Olympics and other Archery focuses competitions!

Trail Running Races: Annual 5K Trail run and 24 Hour Race Ultra! Running for all ages and levels through the trails, around the lakes, over the hills and stream! Runners are able to challenges themselves through the different running events hosted at Genesee Valley annually!

Our commitment to provide high-quality, well maintained facility is part of our founder Tom LaMonica's legacy as a coach to thousands of youth over the course of his life.

The Seedlings Program: Encouraging Growth and Development in the Great Outdoors!

The Seedlings program is designed to provide young children with enriching experiences that promote positive social-emotional skills, academic growth, physical development, and a sense of responsibility towards nature, their communities, and the world at large. In 2023, the program supported seven students through hands-on learning in various outdoor settings, regardless of the weather. We owe the success of this program to the unwavering support of our community and families who share our belief in the importance of connecting children with nature and fostering a deeper relationship with their surroundings.

Maryland's recent passing of bill HB0525 marks a significant milestone in developing curriculum and best practices for outdoor preschools. This is part thanks to ERFANS (Eastern Regions Forest and Nature Schools) and other fellow outdoor preschools who advocated for the passing of the bill. We are thrilled to be a part of this journey towards creating a more immersive and engaging learning experience for our children.



■ Gross Income, \$100,000




Yearly Income Comparison
