PACKING LIST (GENERAL CAMP)

- Water Bottle
- Clothes that are comfortable and can get dirty
- Comfortable walking shoes or sandals with a heel strap (no flip flops, crocs highly discouraged!)
- Extra clothing/extra shoes (shoes will get wet)
- Lunch (non-refrigerated)
- Swimsuit and towel
- Rain jacket
- Sunglasses / hat / sunscreen
- Backpack / tote bag to carry items

An additional packing list will be sent before the Senior Camp overnight.

Genesee Valley is not responsible for any personal property brought to camp. This includes cell phones, any amount of money brought to camp, contraband items (list below), or items of clothing. Children might lose socks, towels or water bottles at camp. GVOLC staff will make a good faith effort to protect the personal belongings of campers, however ultimately are not



responsible for lost, stolen or damaged items.

Genesee Valley is an outdoor facility that engages participants in activities that involve running, climbing, aquatics and high aerial adventures. During any of these activities personal property might go missing or be damaged. A young person might jump into the lake with a cell phone in a pocket, or a sock might be misplaced during a stroll to the lake.

Items found across property will be placed in our "Lost and Found." Our Lost and Found will be available at check out for campers and parents to look through inorder to retrieve missing items. Clothing that has been found to be soiled with bodily fluids may be thrown away according to bloodborne pathogens standards and practices depending on how soiled the garment is.

- Electronic Devices
- Items that can be considered weapons
 - Knives, multi-tools, swords, firearms, throwing stars
 - Matches, lighters, fireworks
- Tobacco, alcohol, illegal drugs, vaping paraphernalia (including nicotine free vaping materials)
- Any materials that violate youth protections laws or are counter to our diversity statement.

Technology:

Genesee Valley is a technology free camp. We feel that devices prevent children from becoming full immersed in nature and experiences. Please keep valuables and devices at home. Genesee Valley is not liable for any damages, missing, or broken devices. Your camper will be asked to keep any technology in their bag or in our office.

Search Policy:

Genesee Valley is private property and has the right to protect our stakeholders from harm and to fulfill our mission statement. For the protection of all staff and campers at GVOLC, Genesee Valley observes the right to search a camper's personal belongings if there is a reasonable suspicion that they are in possession of illegal or dangerous objects. Because GVOLC is responsible for the wellbeing of all campers, it is critical that we are able to control what is brought into the camp setting.



OUR STAFF

Our summer staff is made up of individuals from a wide range of ages and backgrounds. We have college students, teachers, and folks who have been working at Genesee Valley for decades.

Staff must be 18 years or older to work at GVOLC. We hire responsible, compassionate, and enthusiastic people to fill our counselor positions. Staff go through an interview process and are background checked before hiring. Each camp counselor attends an intensive two week training where they learn technical skills and group development techniques.

EARLY PICK UP

If you need to pick your child up early, please call the office (410-343-0138) or email camp@geneseevalley.org to let us know so that we can coordinate getting your camper to the office at the appropriate time. All authorized persons picking up a camper will need to come to the office to sign that child out.

Any adult who picks up a camper must be included on that camper's "Authorized pick up" list. Parents can add authorized adults through the camper registration. A parent can also send in a handwritten note or email (camp@geneseevalley.org) with the authorized person's name if someone needs to be added last minute.

LATE DROP OFF

If you need to drop your child late (after 9:00am), please call the office (410-343-0138) or email camp@geneseevalley.org to let us know so that we can communicate the message to their counselor.

REGISTRATION

All camp registration takes place through CampBrain (follow the "Register Here" links on our website to create an account).

Through a CampBrain account, parents/guardians will:

- Record family contact information
- Insert camper general and medical information
- Register for camp weeks



- Make online payments
- And much more...

WAITLISTS

- If sessions are full, you can add your camper to the waitlist
- Waitlists are compiled in the order they were processed. Once a spot opens up, office staff will begin calling, starting from the first person who added their name to the waitlist. That person will have 24 hours to respond until we move to the next person in line.
- You are welcome to call our office or email us at camp@geneseevalley.org to learn the spot you
 are in on the waitlist. If your plans have changed, please contact us so we can remove your name
 from the waitlist.
- The only time you will be contacted by us regarding the waitlist is to be offered a spot.

PAYMENTS AND REFUNDS

- A \$100 deposit **per week, per camper** is required to reserve your spot.
- Deposits are due online at the time of registration. Deposits are non-refundable and non-transferable to other weeks. The deposit reserves your campers spot for that week.
- Payments are due 21 days before the first day of the camp week. Payments are automatically processed through the payment method used during registration.
- Cancellations that occur at least 21 days before the first day of the registered camp week will be credited or refunded except for the non-refundable, non-transferable deposit.
- Cancellations that occur within the three weeks prior to the first day of camp forfeit 100% of the total registration cost + non-refundable, non transferable deposit.

Debit card payments run without additional charge. Credit card payments will automatically include a 3% surcharge.



Grouping Request Policy:

Because of the extremely large number of requests we receive to put campers with friends and in order to ensure an enjoyable experience for other children that may be in the same group, the following guidelines are in place to discourage cliques and allow GVOLC to be fair to all families with regards to groupings:

- 1. Grouping requests are limited to one other child per week and are made at the discretion of Genesee Valley.
- 2. The request must be made in writing or through registration and the family of the requested child must make the same request on their account.
- 3. No requests will be honored if not done when registering or in writing at least two weeks before the scheduled camp starting date.
- 4. Groupings are not guaranteed.

Facilities + Activities:

Genesee Valley Outdoor Learning Center is made up of about 150 acres of farmland and forest. Here is a list of the notable features of the property that make our camp activities possible:

- Animal pen which houses our goats, Bonnie and Clyde
- Archery range
- Arts and Crafts building
- Chicken coop
- Climbing Wall (The Alby)
- Fields for sports like soccer and kickball
- Forests for fort building
- GaGa Pits
- Garden including vegetables, herbs, fruits, and flowers
- Lakes for swimming, fishing, boating, and zip n' dips
- Lil Sprouts Barn
- Nature Center
- Nature coves like "The Secret Hole" for play and nature exploration
- Playground



- Several high ropes courses including climbing elements, aerial courses, ziplines, "zip n' dips" and wire bridges
- Three low ropes courses
- "The Arc": Main office and nurses office

WEATHER

Camp runs rain or shine. During inclement weather, camp groups are housed in four separate buildings on the main side of property (where drop off and pick up take place).

CAMP NURSES

We have an on-call camp nurse who assists us in collecting and organizing medical paperwork, advisement of medical policies, and more.

MEDICAL HISTORY

Please thoroughly and honestly complete your child's medical form in CampBrain. Our camp nurses will inform counselors of pertinent camper information. Complete information about your child will help us to make their week fun and successful.



CAMPER MEDICATIONS

If your child needs to take a medication while at camp:

- Complete a Medication Authorization Form (in the CampBrain registration)
- Drop off medication to office staff on the first day of the camp week. Medication should be packaged in a labeled bottle with enough medication for the week.
